d. MEDPROS Individual Medical Readiness Record. MEDPROS IMR Record can be obtained by accessing your AKO / My Medical / My Medical readiness / View Detailed Information / IMR record. Medical documentation other than MEDPROS Individual Medical Readiness Record will not be accepted.

e. Copies of all temporary and permanent profiles.

f. DA Form 705 (Army Physical Fitness Test Score Card), must show a minimum of last five record tests; most current test not older than one year. A statement explaining the absence of record tests is required.

g. Certified Height/Weight (HT/WT) or DA 5500 / DA 5501 (if applicable); not older than 30 days from the close date of this announcement. HT/WT on the APFT scorecard is NOT a substitute.

h. ERB (Enlisted Record Brief).

i. Previous 5 DA 2166-8/9 (NCO Evaluation Report) or Commander's Letter of Recommendation for E4s, to include E5s with insufficient time in grade.

j. DA Photograph in Class A uniform, taken within one year (an unofficial photograph is acceptable). If currently deployed, a photograph in ACUs is acceptable.

k. Retirement Point Accounting Management (RPAM).

l. Current Personnel Qualification Record (PQR).

m. Copy of current driver's license and military driver's license.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

This position is located at 1-204th REG (AR), Gowen Field, Boise, Idaho. The purpose of this position is to train Soldiers from the National Guard and Active Army on the M1A1, M1A2 SEPv2 Abrams Tank. Instruction encompasses operation, maintenance, calibration, capabilities, FTX/STX and live fire. In addition, instruct and mentor ALC Students on current doctrine and tactics.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A 19K MOS-T instructor must train and evaluate Tank Crewmen in 10 level tasks as well as safely control the actions of crewmembers during tank live fire. 19K TC3 instructors must provide advanced instruction covering the Abrams fire control system's capabilities and usage. An ALC instructor is required to facilitate doctrinal based tactics education and assess students on terrain board, STX and FTX evaluations. In addition, assist the Course Manager in the planning, organization, coordination and supervision of all armor training activities. Assists in performing operator maintenance of all tracked vehicles. Responsible for the safety and well-being of 3-4 Students during each class. Act as Platoon Sergeant/OC during FTX/STX. Must be available prior to/after duty hours to insure all training is conducted to standard.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- May apply if holding the rank of SGT (Promotable) or SSG.
- Must have documented experience (12 months preferred) as an M1A1 or M1A2 SEP V2 tank commander.
- Soldier will take the Army Physical Fitness Test/Weigh-In semi-annually.
- Must currently hold or have the ability to obtain a SECRET clearance.
- Must have a valid military driver's license and be capable of operating the unit's vehicles.
- Hold the ASI of A8/K8, or meet the academic prerequisites to attend M1A1/M1A2 SEPv2 Master Gunner's Course.
- Soldier must be flexible with long work days and able to stay in the field for short periods of time (3-5 days) at a time.
- Recommend Instructor Qualified with "8" identifier.
