ELIGIBILITY:	Open to current service members of all components of the Army or Marine Corps who hold the grade of E5 (Promotable) to E7. Applicants must be Army MOS 19D or Marine Corps equivalent qualified. Applicants must be willing to transfer to the Idaho Army National Guard. See page 4 for other eligibility requirements. Service members holding the grade of E7 will agree to a voluntary reduction to the grade of E6 upon acceptance of position.

3. Applicants must possess a valid State Motor Vehicle Operator license.

c. NGB Form 34-1 (completed and signed).

d. MEDPROS Individual Medical Readiness Record. MEDPROS IMR Record can be obtained by accessing your AKO / My Medical / My Medical Readiness / View Detailed Information / IMR Record. Medical documentation other than MEDPROS Individual Medical Readiness Record will not be accepted.

e. Copies of any current temporary and permanent profiles.

f. DA Form 705 (Army Physical Fitness Test Score Card) showing a minimum of the last five record tests with the most current test not older than one year. A statement explaining the absence of record tests is required.

g. Certified Height/Weight (HT/WT) Memo or DA 5500/5501 dated within 30 days of the close date of this announcement. HT/WT on the APFT scorecard is NOT a substitute.

h. ERB (Enlisted Record Brief). If there is an ASVAB score requirement and you are not MOS qualified for the position, scores must be on your ERB. Otherwise, documentation must be attached showing current ASVAB scores.

i. Previous five DA 2166-8/2166-9 (NCO Evaluation Report) or Commander's Letter of Recommendation for E4s, to include E5s with insufficient time in grade.

j. DA Photograph in Army Service Uniform, taken within one year (an unofficial photograph is acceptable). If currently deployed, a photograph in ACUs/OCPs is acceptable.

k. Retirement Point Accounting Management (RPAM).

l. Current Personnel Qualification Record (PQR).

m. Copy of current driver's license and military driver's license.

n. DD 369 (attached to this announcement); fill out blocks 1-9 and sign block 11.

o. Documentation supporting applicant's qualifications i.e. resume, certificates, etc. (optional).

p. All applicants must have or be able to obtain a Secret security clearance (this is a condition of employment).

q. If an administrative reduction is necessary to accept this AGR appointment, complete a DA 4187 to request voluntary reduction, sign, and include in your application packet.

r. All applicants must have or be able to obtain a Government Travel card within 90 days of employment.

5. Acceptance of an AGR position may have an effect on Selected Reserve Incentive Programs to include Bonus payments and/or Student Loan Repayment Program. This will not affect Montgomery GI Bill eligibility. Please check with the Incentives Branch to receive information on how an AGR position would affect you individually.

6. Subject to availability of funds; Permanent Change of Station (PCS) allowance is authorized for incumbents residing outside normal commuting distance as stated by USPFO PAM 37-106.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

This position is located at 1-204th REG (AR), Gowen Field, Boise, Idaho. The purpose of this position is to instruct, train, and mentor Soldiers from the National Guard, Reserves, and Active Army on the HMMWV (M1151) and the Bradley (M2) platforms. The instructor must be able to train weapon systems that include the M242 automatic gun, M2 HB .50 Cal machine gun, M240B/M240C machine guns, and the MK19 grenade machine gun. They must also be proficient in the instruction of land navigation and reconnaissance skills performed by a 19D Scout. Instruction encompasses operation, maintenance, capabilities, FTX/STX, and live fire.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A 19D Instructor must instruct, train, and evaluate 19D Cavalry Scouts MOS-T in 10 level tasks, 19D Advance Leaders Course Phase 1 and Phase II in 20-30 level tasks, 19D 2-3-4 (T) Transition course in 20-40 level tasks, and 19D Bradley Commanders Certification Course in Bradley Fighting vehicle specifics tasks. In addition, assists the Course Manager in the planning, organization, coordination, and supervision of all 19D Cavalry Scout training activities. Assists in performing unit maintenance of all equipment assigned to ensure it is ready for instructional periods. Responsible for the safety and well-being of 3-4 Students during each class. Acts as Commander/Platoon Sergeant/OC during STX/FTX training. Must be available prior to/after duty hours to ensure all training is conducted to standard.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- May apply if holding the rank of SGT (Promotable), SSG, or SFC (SFC will be administratively reduced, if selected).
- Must have documented experience (12 months preferred) as a Scout Section Sergeant and/or Scout Platoon Sergeant.
- M2A2 or M2A3 Bradley Master Gunner recommended.
- Soldier will take the Army Physical Fitness Test/Weigh-In semi-annually.
- Must currently hold or have the ability to obtain a SECRET clearance.
- Must have a valid military driver's license and be capable of operating the unit's vehicles.
- Soldier must be flexible with long work days and able to stay in the field for short periods of time (3-5 days).
- Must be able to obtain Instructor Qualified "8" identifier.
- Additional duties as assigned.
